### Standard Cost:

- ❑ \$200/Week (Monday-Friday from 8:30a.m.-3:30p.m.)
- ❑ **One-time registration fee of \$20 per child.** This fee covers registration costs, camp t-shirt, and camp supplies.
- ❑ 10% family discount for more than one child enrolled in CFS Summer Camps, applied to the lowest tuition rate(s).
- ❑ **Club Wolf: Enroll in ten or more weeks of summer camp and get a \$200 discount.** Wolves are very intelligent and committed to their pack, just like our campers who attend the whole summer! Campers who attend all ten weeks get to be part of the exclusive Club Wolf.
- ❑ **Before Care and After Care.** CFS provides before care from 8:00am-8:30am and after care from 3:30pm-6:00pm for an additional \$5/hour. Before care and after care will be invoiced at the end of each month.
- ❑ Late pick-up charges (as per CFS policy):
  - \$5.00 flat fee for pick-up between 3:30-3:35 and 6:00-6:05. \$1.00 fee for every additional minute thereafter. As a courtesy to our staff, please pick up your child in a timely manner.

AGREEMENT**

By signing this Release of Liability and Indemnity Agreement, I acknowledge that my child will be participating in activities associated with the Kinnikinnick Summer Camp Program of Clark Fork School. This agreement is entered into by Clark Fork School, for itself and on behalf of its employees, agents, officers, board members, directors, trustees, instructors, and any other representatives, including, but not limited to, parents or guardians assisting in associated activities.

I understand that while Clark Fork School strives to provide a safe and enjoyable experience, participating in outdoor activities is inherently dangerous. Such activities pose a risk of emotional or physical injury, including the possibility of serious bodily injury or death. I understand that damage to property may also occur due to my child's participation in program activities. I understand that these injuries or outcomes may arise from my child or other's actions, inaction, negligence, conditions related to travel, or the condition of the activity locations. Despite these risks and all other risks, and TO THE FULLEST EXTENT ALLOWED BY LAW, I AGREE TO EXPRESSLY ASSUME ALL RISKS OF INJURY OR DEATH, BOTH KNOWN AND UNKNOWN TO ME, that might be associated with or arise out of my child's participation in Kinnikinnick.

In consideration for my child being allowed to participate in any and all activities associated with Kinnikinnick, I release from all liability Clark Fork School and its representatives. I further agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless all representatives for any claims, lawsuits, damages, attorney fees, costs, or judgments arising out of my child's participation in Kinnikinnick. In consideration of Clark Fork School accepting my child and in consideration of services rendered, my child and I hereby understand and acknowledge the following:

- 1) Voluntarily request that the student participate in any and all activity or activities.
- 2) Represent the student is fully capable of participating in all activities and agree to disclose all known limitations to CFS, including, but not limited to, medical conditions, physical limitations, and any other limitation known to the student or parents.
- 3) Recognize that the student may not be skilled in one or all of the activities and that engaging in any activity may require a degree of skill and knowledge which the student may not possess.
- 4) Certain risks are inherent in some activities and cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of the activity. These risks may include, but are not limited to, the inherent dangers related to physical activity, hazards of traveling in and to areas without medical services or care, dangers due to the forces of nature, dehydration, falls, injury caused by malfunction or failure of any equipment, injury or sickness resulting from food, allergies, transportation accidents, and others.
- 5) Recognize that the foregoing description of risks is incomplete, and these risks and other unlisted, unknown, or unanticipated risks may result in injury or death.
- 6) The student has responsibilities as a participant to listen to any instructions, warnings, or risk assessments, to ask for instruction or clarification whenever needed, and to follow instructions.
- 7) CFS and its associates may remove the student from activities for any breach of safety policies, or any conduct that is deemed unsafe.

**Consent to Medical Treatment:**

In the event of a medical emergency to my child, I authorize Clark Fork School or its representatives to provide emergency first aid treatment and/or refer treatment to a duly licensed physician, dentist, or other medical care to my child. ## Kinnikinnick Summer Camp Weekly Themes

**Who is the Kinnikinnick Summer Camp Program for?** Students going into Kindergarten and 1st grade who want to engage in meaningful, fun, and place-based activities. You do not need to be a CFS student to attend – in fact, we encourage new families to participate!

### **Week 1: June 12-16 – Galivanting in the Garden**

This week, we will spend most of our time playing and learning from the CFS garden. We'll also get to visit other local gardens to learn how many different ways there are to grow things. We'll have fun planting and harvesting, create some yummy garden-fresh treats, build fantastical fairy gardens, learn from the chickens and enhance our wildlife and pollinator habitats!

### **Week 2: June 19 – 23 – Marvelous Mud and Divine Dirt**

This week focuses on digging, creating, planting, and exploring as we dive into a childhood wonder – mud! We will hunt for bugs, make delectable nature pies, explore the garden, and create artistic masterpieces. Leave your nice clothes at home this week, because CFS students are powered by dirt!

### **Week 3: June 26 – 30 – Montana Creatures Big and Small**

Come join us to discover Montana's wild side! We will learn to think like a deer, hunt like a bird, and hide like a reptile. We will visit the Zoological Museum and learn about the amazing adaptations that allow animals to survive in the Missoula Valley. We'll even splash away the heat in our local creek as we discover the micro-organisms that call the Rattlesnake home.

### **Week 4: July 3, 5-7 - Wilderness Explorers (There will be no camp on Tuesday, July 4<sup>th</sup>).**

Learn how to survive in the wild! We will learn how to build a campfire, build an emergency shelter, and identify edible plants. Students will become survival experts as they learn orienteering skills and backcountry cooking. The magic of the great outdoors will be our guide this week!

### **Week 5: July 10-14 – A Bug's Life**

Indulge your curiosity as we investigate the insects that live all around us. There will be plenty of adventuring this week as we explore the lives of our local creepy-crawlies! During this fun-filled and educational camp, we will become bugs and create make-believe homes for ourselves. We will search for insects in the nearby hills and streams, learn how to use field guides to identify unknown bugs, and visit the Missoula Insectarium!

### **Week 6: July 17-21 – Time Traveling through Missoula**

Visit different phases in Missoula's history as we explore how Missoula has changed over the eons. We will explore the mysteries of Glacial Lake Missoula. We will discover how Native Americans originally used the land and where they settled. We will re-live the life of early homesteaders and will learn about the coming of the railroad. This week requires lots of field trips and tons of imagination!

### **Week 7: July 24-28 – Water, Water Everywhere!**

This week is all about one of our most precious natural resources – water! We will explore our local watershed, play at our favorite splash parks, and investigate the water cycle. We'll also practice fun ways to help conserve water and protect our water habitats. Dive into this week for gallons of watery fun!
